Winterfest Announces Winners, Awards and Cash Prizes of Fantasy Boat Student Art Contest

The Winterfest Foundation Inspires 631 Budding Artists with Fantasy Boat Student Art Contest

Broward County, FL- The Winterfest Foundation recently hosted judging for the 2018-2019 Winterfest Fantasy Boat Student Art Contest.

This year, 631 students from 22 Broward County public, private, and charter schooled children used their imagination to create drawings depicting what type of boat they would like to see in the annual Seminole Hard Rock Winterfest Boat Parade. The artwork from students in 3rd, 4th and 5th grades will be displayed at the Museum of Discovery and Science followed by an awards reception underwritten by BBX Capital on March 5, 2019. All participating students are invited to the reception where they will receive certificates, refreshments, see their artwork on display and enjoy the Museum exhibits.

Judges were representatives of the Winterfest Foundation, Museum of Discovery and Science and the event chair, Rosalie Wheatley.

"Being a judge for the Winterfest Student Art Contest was so much fun and it brought back fond memories of when I was a young art student participating in similar contests. It was great to see so many wonderful and creative submissions, especially from outside-the-box thinkers. We really have some talented kids in Broward County! The Museum of Discovery and Science is really looking forward to hosting the Awards Ceremony and Reception in March," said Marcela Gurdián, Creative Director for Museum of Discovery and Science.

Twenty-three students will receive their artwork framed with a plaque noting their winning status. A copy of the framed artwork will also be given to their school. Cash prizes will be given to first, second and third place winners and their school will receive a stipend for the classroom.

Ms. Buttonow, a teacher at Mary Help of Christians Elementary will receive \$150 for the largest number of student submissions (92 students). Ms. Miller, a teacher at North Broward Academy of

Excellence, will receive a gift certificate for the second largest amount of artwork submissions (90 students).

The mission of the Museum of Discovery and Science is to provide experiential pathways to lifelong learning in science for children and adults through exhibits, programs and films. Founded in 1976 as The Discovery Center, the Museum provides enriching Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education to approximately 400,000 visitors annually.
